WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

August 13 2025 Exodus 29:38-46

Introduction:

- 1. God required five key sacrifices to be made: Two mandatory and three voluntary.
- 2. The daily sacrifices were the culmination of chapters 25-29 and were central for Israel to maintain their covenant relationship with God.

I. THE SACRIFICE

- A. What was to be offered?
 - 1. **Exodus 29.38:** "two lambs of the first year" (cf. Num. 28.3)
 - 2. **Exodus 29.40,41:** "the grain offering and the drink offering"
 - 3. God expected the best of Israel. (Mal. 1.8)
- B. When was it to be offered?
 - 1. Exodus 29.38,42: "day by day continually."
 - 2. Exodus 29.39: It was to be offered every morning and evening. (Num. 28.4)
- C. Where was it to be offered?
 - 1. Exodus 29.42: "at the door of the tabernacle of meeting before the Lord"
 - 2. What was the tabernacle of meeting? (Ex. 33.7,8; 40.7, 24-26; Lev. 6.12,13)

II. THE SIGNIFICANCE

- A. The significance of the daily sacrifices was twofold.
 - 1. Communion: The daily sacrifices provided a place for God's continual presence in the midst of His people. (Ex. 29.43-46)
 - 2. Atonement: The daily sacrifice were called a "continual burnt offering" which maintained Israel's relationship with God. (cf. Lev. 1.4; Heb. 7.27)
- B. Historically, the daily sacrifices were made a priority.
 - 1. After returning the ark, David established the daily offerings. (1 Chr. 16.40)
 - 2. Its central role and reason for building Solomon's temple. (2 Chr. 2.4)
 - 3. It was one of the first acts when Israel returned from captivity. (Ezra 3.3-6)
 - 4. The prediction of Israel's destruction was catastrophic due to their being forced to cease the daily sacrifices (Dan. 8.11,12; 9.27; 11.31)

III. THE SHADOW

- A. Jesus is "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1.29)
- B. As a shadow of what was to come, the daily sacrifices were compared to Jesus.
 - 1. Hebrews 7.23,24: Jesus has "an unchanging priesthood."
 - 2. **Hebrews 7.25:** "since He always lives to make intercession for them."
 - 3. **Hebrews 7.26,27:** *"who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices"* One sacrifice to cleanse us of all sins. (Heb. 10.11,12)
- C. As we make mistakes, the blood of Jesus is always there to cleanse us. (1 John 1.7)
