WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

FEBRUARY 21, 2024 EXODUS 1.15-22

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. In keeping with His promise, "the children of Israel were fruitful and increased abundantly, multiplied and grew exceedingly mighty; and the land was filled with them" (Ex. 1.7).
- a) To stunt their growth, the Egyptians first "afflicted them with burdens," but Israel "multiplied and grew" (Ex. 1.11,12).
- b) Second, the Egyptians "made the children of Israel serve with rigor" and "made their lives bitter with hard bondange" (Ex. 1.13,14). But they continued to grow.
- 2. The next section records Pharaoh's third attempt to thin out the Hebrews who have saturated the Egyptian culture.

I. THE REQUIREMENT OF PHARAOH

- A. **Exodus 1.15:** "Then the king of Egypt spoke to the Hebrew midwives"
 - 1. Pharaoh gave the midwives two directives.
 - a) **Exodus 1.16:** "if it is a son, then you shall kill him"
 - b) **Exodus 1.16:** "if it is a daughter, then she shall live"
 - 2. When the midwives refused to obey the commands of Pharaoh, he issued a general command to "all his people." (Ex. 1.22).
- B. The brutalness of Pharaoh is shocking.
 - 1. Consider the use of the words, "son" and "daughter" (Ex. 1.16,22).
 - 2. This is not the only time you read about infanticide. (Matt. 2.16-18)
 - 3. Today, pro-abortionists often dehumanize infants. (cf. Ps. 139.13-16)

II. THE RESPECT OF THE MIDWIVES

- A. Who are the Hebrew midwives?
 - 1. **EXODUS 1.15:** "Hebrew midwives, of whom the name of one was Shiphrah and the name of the other Puah" Two midwives who presumably the head of the midwives.
 - 2. **Exodus 1.16:** "When you do the duties of a midwife"
 - a) Midwife (yalad): Literally, "to give birth, have a child" [Mounce]
 - b) What are the duties of the midwives? (Gen. 35.17; 38.28)
- B. Exodus 1.17: "But the midwives feared God"
 - 1. Fear (yare): "To be afraid, be frightened, revere, respect" [Mounce] (Ps. 89.7; 119.9)
 - 2. The influence of the Hebrew nation spread throughout their generations.
 - a) Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph feared God. (Gen. 22.12; 26.23-25; 42.18)
 - b) The fear of God is to be taught to our children. (Deut. 4.9,10; Eph. 6.4)
 - 3. The midwives feared God more than the king. (Ex. 1.17-19; cf. Acts 4.19; 5.29)

III. THE REWARD OF GOD

- A. **Exodus 1.20:** "Therefore God dealt well with the midwives"
 - 1. "Dealt well" Literally, what is pleasing. (cf. Gen. 4.7). God made their lives pleasing.
 - 2. **Exodus 1.21:** "He provided households for them." (cf. Ruth 4.11)
- B. Did God justify lying?
 - 1. The midwives were deceptive. (Ex. 1.19; cf. Josh. 2.4-6; James 2.25)
 - 2. The blessing of God was not from lying, but from their fear of Him.
