## WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

# October 15, 2025 Exodus 32:19-35

#### **Introduction:**

- 1. Not long after directly hearing the voice of God issue specific commands concerning idolatry, the children of Israel created a golden calf and worshipped it.
  - a) How was their bad decision characterized? (Ex. 32.7,8,21,22,30-33)
  - b) How were the children of Israel characterized? (Ex. 32.7,9,11,14,22,25)
- 2. As the leader of Israel, Moses dealt with the sin of Israel and what they had become.

## I. RIGHTEOUS ANGER

- A. **Exodus 32.19:** "So Moses' anger became hot, and he cast the tablets out of his hands and broke them at the foot of the mountain."
  - 1. Anger (ap): Nose. Literally, "the nose of Moses burned." This was a physiological and observable effect of how Moses felt.
  - 2. Moses expressed his anger in a public way.
    - a) **Exodus 32.19:** *"he cast the tablets out of his hands and broke them at the foot of the mountain."* Uncontrolled or purposeful? (Deut. 9.17)
    - b) **Exodus 32.20:** Moses made Israel drink the calf.
  - 3. Compare his reaction to the reaction of Aaron. (Ex. 32.21-24)
- B. The righteous anger of Moses emphasizes the seriousness of sin.
  - 1. Why is sin so serious? (Isa. 59.2; 1.15; Prov. 15.29; Rom. 6.23)
  - 2. How are some ways that people react to sin? (Ex. 32.24; 1 Cor. 5.1,2,6; Gal. 6.1)

## II. DECISIVE ACTION

- A. The condition of Israel.
  - 1. **Exodus 32.25:** The people were unrestrained. Literally, let loose.
  - 2. **Exodus 32.25:** Aaron was an enabler who allowed them to run wild. Are we responsible for the behavior of others? (cf. 1 Sam. 3.13; Ezek. 18.20)
  - 3. **Exodus 32.25:** Their behavior was visible by their enemies. (Phil. 2.15)
- B. The call for loyalty.
  - 1. **Exodus 32.26:** "Whoever is on the Lord's side-come to me?"
  - 2. **Exodus 32.27,28:** The consequence of their sin. (cf. Heb. 2.2,3)
  - 3. **Exodus 32.29:** The consecration of the Israelites.

## III. PASSIONATE INTERCESSION

- A. Moses goes back up the mountain to meet with God.
  - 1. Exodus 32.30: His purpose: "I can make atonement for your sin"
  - 2. Exodus 32.31,32: His heart: "blot me out of Your book" (cf. Rom. 9.3)
  - 3. **Exodus 32.33-35:** His response: "Whoever has sinned against me..."
- B. God's justice and mercy are revealed. (Deut. 9.19,20; Rom. 11.22)
