December 10, 2025 Exodus 33:7ff

Introduction:

- 1. God caused His goodness to pass before Moses by proclaiming His character.
- 2. Most of His attributes focus on His compassion (Ex. 34.6,7)
- 3. God is also a God of righteousness demanding an accounting for sin. (Rom. 11.22)

I. THE CONDITION OF FORGIVENESS

- A. Who are the guilty?
 - 1. **Exodus 34.7:** "by no means clearing the guilty..."
 - 2. "Guilty" (v'nakkeh lo yenakkeh): Literally, "Clearing, He will not clear"
 - 3. Emphatic to convey certainty. (Ex. 33.35; Josh. 24.19)
 - 4. His justice negates the concept of cheap grace. (Luke 14.33)
- B. Three words which define guilt before God. (Ex. 34.7)
 - 1. Iniquity (awon): "crooked, perversion" [Mounce] (2 Pet. 2.20-22)
 - 2. Transgression (pesa): "rebellion" [Mounce] (cf. Heb. 3.16)
 - 3. Sin (hata): "missing the mark" [Mounce] (cf. 1 John 5.17)
- C. Not a contradiction but a condition.
 - 1. Principle of forgiveness. (Ps. 34.18; Prov. 28.13; Isa. 66.2)
 - 2. Application of forgiveness. (1 Kings 21.27-29; 2 Kings 22.18-20; 2 Cor. 7.10)

II. THE CONSEQUENCE OF SIN

- A. The consequences of sin extend to future generations.
 - 1. **Exodus 34.7:** "visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children..."
 - 2. How did their sin affect their children? (Num. 14.17-19,20-23,31-33)
- B. Two consequences that are passed on to your children.
 - 1. The consequence of suffering. (Lam. 5.7; Gen. 3.16-19)
 - 2. The consequence of influence. (Ezek. 16.44,45; Rom. 5.12)
- C. Consequences vs. Culpability.
 - 1. **Ezekiel 18.1-3:** Israel complained that they were innocent victims.
 - 2. **Ezekiel 18.4-18:** God calls for personal responsibility.
 - 3. **Ezekiel 18.19-29:** Israel accused God of being unfair.
 - 4. **Ezekiel 18.30-32:** "Therefore, I will judge you...Repent, and turn from all your transgressions, so that iniquity will not be your ruin."

III. THE COMPULSION OF MOSES

- A. Moses was compelled to worship.
 - 1. Exodus 34.8: "So Moses made haste and bowed his head toward the earth"
 - 2. Knowing God's compassion and justice moves us to worship. (Heb. 12.28,29)
- B. Moses appealed to God's grace. (Ex. 34.9)
