## WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

# August 13 2025 Exodus 29:18-34

#### **Introduction:**

- 1. The office of the high priest was to mediate between God and man to help Israel maintain their relationship with God. (Heb. 5.1)
- 2. To minister as priests before God on behalf of Israel, Aaron and his sons had to first be made holy. (Lev. 11.44,45; Heb. 12.14; 1 Pet. 1.13-15; 2.5; Ex. 28.41)
- 3. In verses 19-33, we read of a special peace offering by killing the second ram. This offering also included wave and heave offerings. (Ex. 29.19)

## I. THE FOUNDATION: CONSECRATION OF THE PRIESTS

- A. The ram was a substitute for Aaron and his sons.
  - 1. **Exodus 29.19:** They were to "put their hands on the head of the ram."
  - 2. In the New Testament, Christ is our substitute. (1 Pet. 3.15; Heb. 10.10)
- B. The blood of the ram was applied to Aaron and his sons.
  - 1. **Exodus 29.20:** It was applied to "the tip of the right ear." The ear represented hearing the word. (cf. Matt. 13.9)
  - 2. **Exodus 29.20:** It was applied to "the thumb of their right hand" The hand represented obeying the word. (cf. Acts 4.27,28)
  - 3. **Exodus 29.20:** It was applied to "the big toe of their right foot" The foot represented walking in the word. (cf. Rom. 6.4, 8.1; 2 Cor. 5.7)
- C. **Exodus 29.21:** The blood of the ram was sprinkled on their garments.

#### II. THE FUNCTION: CONSECRATION OF THE WORK

- A. The wave offering.
  - 1. Exodus 29.22: "it is the ram of consecration" Lit., "to fill." (v. 24)
  - 2. Exodus 29.23,24: They give back what God has given. (cf. 1 Chr. 29.14)
  - 3. **Exodus 29.25:** "burn them on the altar as a burnt offering" **NASB:** "on the burnt offering" The offering is pleasing and acceptable to God. (cf. 1 Pet. 2.5)
- B. The heave offering.
  - 1. **Exodus 29.26:** "it shall be your portion" (cf. 2 Cor. 9.3-7,14)
  - 2. Exodus 29.27: "Heave" (teruma): "to be high, exalted, to rise."
  - 3. Exodus 29.28: It would come "their peace offerings" (cf. Lev. 7.28-36)
- C. The sacred meal.
  - 1. Exodus 29.30,31: "Then Aaron and his sons shall eat"
  - 2. **Exodus 29.32,33:** "an outsider shall not eat them, because they are holy."
  - 3. **Exodus 29.34:** "you shall burn the remainder with fire. It shall not be eaten, because it is holy."
  - 4. Eating was often an act of communion. (Acts 2.42,46; 1 Cor. 10.14-22)
