WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

December 3, 2025 Exodus 33:5ff

Introduction:

- 1. In Exodus 33, Moses made a request: "Please, show me Your glory" (Ex. 33.18).
 - a) God's response: "I will make all My goodness pass before you" (Ex. 33.19)
 - b) The glory of God is not merely an abstract, dazzling light, but is practically and powerfully demonstrated in His divine character His goodness.
 - c) His goodness makes His glory visible. To understand it is to see His glory.
- 2. In Exodus 34, God shows the His glory as He promised.

I. THE PRESENCE OF GOD

- A. **Exodus 34.5:** "the LORD descended in the cloud and stood with him there"
 - 1. The direction of God's presence. (cf. Deut. 30.11-14; cf. Gen. 3.8; 11.5; Ex. 19.11)
 - 2. The intimacy of God's presence. (cf. Ex. 33.3,15)
- B. God has always reached out to humanity.
 - 1. Romans 10.5-8: God brings His message to us.
 - 2. Ultimately, God reached out to mankind through Jesus. (John 14.8,9)

II. THE PROCLAMATION OF GOD

- A. The metaphysical character of God.
 - 1. God does not define Himself by His appearance, but by His character.
 - 2. **Exodus 34.5:** "proclaimed the name of the LORD." (Ex. 6.2,3; 33.19)
 - 3. Exodus 34.6: "The LORD, the LORD God." Grammatical emphasis.
 - 4. God is known by many descriptive terms. (Ex. 6.3; Gen. 1.1; 15.2)
- B. The moral character of God.
 - 1. His feelings toward us: "merciful and gracious" (v. 6). Rechim: "womb"
 - 2. His patience toward us: "longsuffering" (v. 6). Lit., "long nose."
 - 3. His commitment toward us: "abounding in goodness and truth." Carries the idea of a love that is reliable. (v. 7; cf. 2 Sam. 16.17; Ps. 51.1; Jer. 23.28).

III. THE PARADOX OF GOD

- A. The scope of His forgiveness.
 - 1. **Exodus 34.7:** "forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin"
 - 2. The grace of God is not cheap. (cf. Luke 14.33)
- B. The seriousness of His justice.
 - 1. **Exodus 34.7:** "by no means clearing the guilty" The mercy of God does not nullify His justice. Sin must be addressed. (cf. Josh. 24.19)
 - 2. **Exodus 34.7:** *"visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children..."* Sin has consequences that can last for generations. (Num. 14.17-19,20-23)
- C. How did Moses respond? (Ex. 34.8,9)
