### WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

# September 3, 2025 Exodus 30:17-21

#### **Introduction:**

- 1. In addition to the altar of burnt offering, a laver was set up within the tabernacle.
- 2. The laver was set in place to ensure that the serve of the tabernacle performed by the priests was always a holy service. (Isa. 57.15; 1 John 1.5; 1 Tim. 6.16; 2 Cor. 6.14-16)
- 3. That the priests were required to wash before performing a service points to continuing nation of sin and our need to be cleansed continually.

#### I. THE BRONZE LAVER

- A. The prescription.
  - 1. **Exodus 30:17,18:** "Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying: 'You shall also make a laver of bronze, with its base also of bronze"
  - 2. Laver (kywr; KEY-yor): A basin used for cooking or washing. (cf. 1 Sam. 2.14)
  - 3. What were the materials used? (Ex. 38.8; cf. 1 Sam. 2.22; Luke 2.37)
  - 4. While we are not given the dimensions, the bronze sea made for the temple is the equivalent of the laver. (1 Kings 7.23-26; 2 Kings 16.10,17,18)
  - 5. Who constructed the laver? (Ex. 31.6-9; 35.10,16,30,34; 37.1; 38.8)
- B. The purpose.
  - 1. **Exodus 30.18:** "for washing" Not to be clean physically, but spiritually.
  - 2. Exodus 30.19: "Aaron and his sons shall wash their hands and their feet"
    - a) Why were they to wash their hands? (Ex. 29.24; 29.37; 30.29,30)
    - b) Why were they to wash their feet? (Ex. 3.5)
  - 3. **Exodus 30.20:** For service in the tabernacle or to burn offerings.
  - 4. Were they not already clean? (Ex. 28.4,43; 29.4,37,38,39)
- C. The penalty.
  - 1. Exodus 30.20,21: "lest they die" Said twice.
  - 2. Exodus 30.21: "And it shall be a statute forever to them" Lit., "to inscribe."

## II. WASHING IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

- A. The Bible associates washing with baptism.
  - 1. "Washing" (baptismos) not to be confused with baptisma or baptizo. (Heb. 6.1)
  - 2. Though the meaning is different, they are used to convey the same concept.
    - a) **Mark 7.4:** "they do not eat unless they wash" (baptisma baptism)
    - b) Mark 7.4: "like the washing of cups..." (baptismos washing)
  - 3. To be baptized is to be washed clean. (Acts 22.16; Titus 3.5; 1 Cor. 6.11))
- B. How often do we need to be made clean?
  - 1. We only need to be baptized once, but made clean always. (cf. Matt. 6.11,12)
  - 2. Every time we come to God, we must be clean. (Lev. 10.3; Heb. 10.22)
