WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS

JANUARY 10, 2024 GENESIS 49:27-33

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Chapter 49 records the last days of Jacob's life as he blesses his twelve sons.
 - a) To whom were the blessings given? (Gen. 49.28)
 - b) From whom did these blessings originate? (Gen. 49.28,1; Ps. 105.9,10,15)
 - c) What did these blessing entail? (Gen. 49.28)
- 2. The last one to be blessed before Jacob died was the tribe of Benjamin.

I. THE BLESSING OF BENJAMIN

- A. GENESIS 49.27: "Benjamin is a ravenous wolf"
 - 1. Ravenous (tarap): To tear in pieces. (cf. Ezek. 22.25-27)
 - 2. "Wolf" is often used of those who are predatory. (Matt. 7.15; 10.16; Acts 20.29)
 - 3. **GENESIS 49.27:** "In the morning he shall devour the prey, And at night he shall divide the spoil." To devour is to simply eat. (cf. Gen. 2.17; Matt. 4.4)
- B. Benjamin would develop into a warlike tribe.
 - 1. Benjamin went to war against the rest of the nation. (Judges 19,20)
 - a) JUDGES 19.12,22-24: A Levite's concubine was abused and left for dead.
 - b) JUDGES 20.14-17: Justice was demanded and war was waged.
 - c) JUDGES 20.21,25,48: Benjamin almost won the war.
 - 2. Men of valor came from Benjamin. (1 Chr. 8.40; 12.1,2; 2 Chr. 14.8,9,14; 17.17)

II. THE DEATH OF JACOB

- A. GENESIS 49.29: "Then he charged them and said to them" Lit., commanded. (v. 33)
 - 1. There is a location.
 - a) **GENESIS 49.29,30:** "the cave that is in the field of Ephron the Hittite, in the cave that is in the field of Machpelah, which is before Mamre in the land of Canaan..."
 - b) In Genesis 23, Abraham bought the land to bury his wife. (Gen. 23.1-11)
 - 2. There is a description.
 - a) **GENESIS 49.31:** "There they buried Abraham and Sarah his wife, there they buried Isaac and Rebekah his wife, and there I buried Leah." (Gen. 35.27-29)
 - b) Who is missing? (Gen. 35.19,20)
 - 3. There is an explanation. (Gen. 49.32; 23.12-18)
- B. GENESIS 49.33: "And when Jacob had finished commanding his sons, he drew his feet up into the bed and breathed his last, and was gathered to his people."
 - 1. How old was Jacob when he died? (Gen. 47.28)
 - 2. Joseph had already promised to bury his father. (Gen. 47.29-31)
- C. Consider the phrase, "gathered to his people"
 - 1. There is a series of consecutive actions all taken in the past tense, i.e., finished, drew, breathed, finished." Each action was taken after the previous.
 - 2. When was Jacob taken to Hebron and buried? (Gen. 50.3,4,12; cf. 25.7-9)
 - 3. Physical death is a separation of body and soul. (James 2.26)
 - a) When does the soul leave the body relative to the burial? (Gen. 35.18)
 - b) Jesus was buried, but His soul went to Hades. (Luke 23.43; Acts 2.27,31)
