WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE CLASS April 10, 2024 Exodus 4:10-12

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Feelings of inadequacy real or imagined will not excuse you from your God-assigned responsibilities. God never expects of us more than we can do.
- 2. Moses was called by God to do a difficult task of being a deliverer and leader of Israel. The feelings of inadequacy of this humble man (Num. 12.3) did not excuse him.
- 3. HIS FOURTH OBJECTION: "O my Lord, I am not eloquent, neither before nor since You have spoken to Your servant; but I am slow of speech and slow of tongue" (Ex. 4.10).

I. THE PROBLEM OF MOSES

- A. Why did Moses hesitate to carry out the task that God assigned?
 - 1. EXODUS 4.10: "O my Lord" A statement of emphatic plea. (cf. Ex. 3.11,13; 4.1)
 - 2. Exodus 4.10: "I am not eloquent"
 - a) "Eloquent" is literally, "man of words." Moses was not an orator. (Acts 18.24,28)b) Moses was not claiming to be unintelligent. (Acts 7.22)
 - 3. ExoDUS 4.10: "but I am slow of speech and slow of tongue"
 a) "Slow" (kabed): "heavy, severe, difficult" Moses was inarticulate. (Ex. 6.12)
 b) Moses was slow in both speech and tongue. What he says and how he says it.
- B. Why do we hesitate to carry out the difficult responsibilities given to us?
 - 1. Though God is capable of acting directly, He has delegated many responsibilities to His people. (Ex. 3.10; 2 Tim. 2.2; 1 Thess. 5.14)
 - 2. Everyone has unique abilities. (Rom. 12.4-8; 1 Cor. 12.18,27-30)
 - 3. However, a lack of ability does not mean a lack of responsibility. (2 Cor. 10.10; 11.6)
 - 4. Is it a matter of pride? Do you want to be an orator? (1 Cor. 1.18-20; 4.8-10)

II. THE PATIENCE OF GOD

- A. How did God respond to Moses?
 - 1. **EXODUS 4.11:** "So the LORD said to him" The One who created everything.
 - 2. ExoDUS 4.11: "Who has made man's mouth? Or who makes the mute, the deaf, the seeing, or the blind? Have not I, the LORD?"
 - a) Does this mean that God is responsible for disabilities? (cf. John 9.1-3)
 - b) The One who gave him his mouth knew what Moses was capable of achieving.
 - 3. EXODUS 4.12: "Now therefore, go"
 - a) Since God knew the abilities of Moses, he was therefore to go as commanded.
 - b) **EXODUS 4.12:** "and I will be with your mouth and teach you what you shall say."
- B. The way God responded to Moses is the way He responds to us.
 - 1. We are never expected to do that which is beyond our abilities.
 - a) Jesus defended the woman because "she has done what she could" (Mark 14.6-8).
 - b) We are not expected to give "according to what he does not have" (2 Cor. 8.12).
 - c) In the parable of the talents, the servants were given responsibilities "*each according to his own ability*" (Matt. 25.14,15).
 - 2. We have more abilities than we think we do.
 - a) The Macedonians gave "beyond their ability" (2 Cor. 8.1-3).
 - b) Develop God confidence rather than self-confidence. (Ex. 4.12; Eph. 6.18,19)
