Exodus 30:34-38

Introduction:

- 1. In Exodus 30.22-38, there are two recipes required for the service of the tabernacle.
 - a) **Exodus 30.22-33:** The recipe for the anointing oil.
 - b) **Exodus 30.34-38:** The recipe for the incense.
- 2. These recipes had to be exactly as God specified. (cf. Lev. 10.1-3)

I. THE RECIPE FOR INCENSE

- A. The command.
 - 1. **Exodus 30.34:** "The Lord said to Moses"
 - 2. Everything we are reading is the instructions given to Moses which will later be delivered to the children of Israel. (Ex. 36ff)
- B. The composition.
 - 1. **Exodus 30.34:** "Take sweet spices." Literally, aromatic spices.
 - 2. **Exodus 30.34:** The incense was composed of four spices.
 - a) Stacte (nataf): literally, "to drop." Believed to be gum resin, sweet aroma.
 - b) Onycha (shekhelet): Lit., "lid." From a mollusk. Musky aroma.
 - c) Galbanum (khelbenah): Gum resin from a perennial herb. Pungent and unpleasant. Acts as a fixative to extend the aroma of other spices.
 - d) Frankincense (levona): Highly prized resin from the Boswellia tree. Sweet.
 - 3. Exodus 30.34: "there shall be equal amounts of each."
- C. The creation.
 - 1. **Exodus 30.35:** "make an incense blended as by the perfumer" (Ex. 37.29)
 - 2. Exodus 30.36: "and you shall beat some of it very fine" Lit., "grind, crush."
- D. The crime.
 - 1. **Exodus 30.37:** "You shall not make any for yourselves according to its Composition." Specifically, making incense according to this recipe.
 - 2. **Exodus 30.38:** "he shall be cut off from his people" (Ex. 31.14; Lev. 20.2,3)

II. LESSONS FROM THE TEXT

- A. Is the death penalty for making incense too harsh?
 - 1. Adam and Eve were cast out of the garden for eating fruit. (Gen. 2.17; 3.11)
 - 2. A man was put to death for gathering sticks on the Sabbath. (Num. 15.32-36)
 - 3. Is any commandment too insignificant to obey? (Heb. 2.2)
- B. God gives us recipes we are expected to follow to the letter.
 - 1. The unleavened bread to represent the body of Jesus. (1 Cor. 11.23,24)
 - 2. The fruit of the vine to represent the blood of Jesus. (1 Cor. 11.25)
 - 3. Would anything else suffice? (1 Cor. 11.20,21)
